Community Activity

The Council acts pro-actively to represent residents and reports issues of concern to the County Council. This includes road safety concerns, fly tipping, footway lighting repairs and planning issues.

Platinum Jubilee Celebrations - May 2022

St Ishmael Community Council worked with Llansaint Welfare Hall, Ferryside Village Hall, Ferryside Rugby, Sports and Social Club and the Ferryside Village Forum to celebrate Her Majesty the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

The support included co-ordinating and advertising events. Financial support was also given to provide live music at Ferryside Rugby, Sports and Social Club and Llansaint Welfare Hall. The Community Council also supported the provision of a community minibus for two of the events.

The events included an art competition and best dressed house competition. The art competition was judged by Dorothy Morris and the art was displayed at a Jubilee Tea Party held at Ferryside Village Hall. The best dressed house competition was judged by Cllr Alicia Dalton, Cllr Jeff Batte and County Cllr Crish Davies. The winners were announced at events and via social media.

The Community Council provided commemorative coins to the children of the parish. The coins were distributed by Community Council Chairman Cllr Alicia Dalton and Cllr Scott Wyld at events held in Llansaint Welfare Hall and Ferryside Village Hall.

Plans for 2023-24
